

The Pedestrian Green Loop and Living Urban Blocks

- W1: Future developments at 1075 Bay Street (POPS) and 10 St. Mary Street could bring enhanced green space.
- W2: The west side of Bay Street leads to St Mary Street - a traffic light installation is planned.
- W3: The new Clover Hill Park is in development on this site with completion in late 2019.
- W4: The new development at 95 St. Joseph Street proposes a green "learning lane" along St. Basil Lane and a green path along the west side of the development. Alternate: Bay Street from Wellesley to St Mary Streets.
- W5: A diagonal passageway at 925 Bay Street connects the new Dr. Lillian McGregor Park (completion 2020) to the Bay-Wellesley intersection.
- W6: Opera Place Park.
- W7: The new 2G development provides for a landscaped path through the property.
- W8: The east side of Bay Street between College Street and Grenville Street.
- W9: Traverse College Park diagonally.

- E1: A visual marker or entrance-way could flag the northeast starting point for the path.
- E2: Some space is used for TPA parking but with a TPA parking garage one block to the north, parking should be eliminated and replaced with an enlarged Norman Jewison Park and a bricked Gloucester Lane.
- E3: This block is currently being re-landscaped.
- E4: The walkway east of the Wellesley subway station is to be widened.
- E5: Development plans for the TPA parking lot call for green parkland and a walkway on the west side of the site.
- E6: New development on Yonge Street should see the Maitland Terrace laneway bricked and parkette enhancements.
- E7: The replacement Courtyard Marriott hotel includes a green walkway on the east of the site in new parkland where the abutting parking lot could be greened with underground parking.
- E8: A private walkway exists east of the Toronto Hydro building which should be opened with a new pedestrian crossing installed on Carlton Street. Alternate: Reverend Porter Lane.
- E9: The new crossing would lead directly to the "blue arch" that leads from Carlton Street to the James Sheard Parkette, which could be expanded.
- E10: The south end of the McGill-Granby Park faces across Yonge Street to an entrance to College Park Park, with plans for a pedestrian crosswalk.
- E11: There is a small green space behind the building on Yonge Street. A new development is proposed on the site. Green space should be expanded and programmed.
